Here are the protocols for this year's Minjerribah Photography Competition. Entries are open from 1 September to 1 November and this year's theme is 'BIRDS' on the course.

- 1. ALL Photo Award competitors need to sign in at the Golf Clubhouse office during opening hours which run from 7am to 5pm daily.
- 2. ALL Photo Award competitors need to get a ticket with a CODE from the Clubhouse and put their details name, address, phone number, time / date on to the ticket stub. They can then use that same code for multiple entries. Photographers will need to use that one-time code when they upload their online entry form on the Straddie Arts Trail section on the lamstraddie.com.au website here is the link: https://iamstraddie.com.au/2025-photo-awards
- 3. Photography Award competitors can hire carts by the hour minimum 20-dollars per hour (or part thereof) for a two-person cart and minimum 40-dollars per hour for family carts. Carts should be pre-booked by phoning the office on 34099999. Preference is always given to golfers with photographers able to hire carts that are not otherwise in use.
- Photography Award competitors who walk must stay on the tracks marked "yellow brick trail" — there is a map on the club score card and on the IAM Straddie website.
